### Citing references - LibGuides at University of Reading

Example: Cedar, M. (1938). Mars at night (sculpture). Manor Art Gallery, Manchester. In the body of the text you will always refer to the artwork directly, so can build your citation into your sentence and do not need to use a brief in-text citation. Example: In Cedar's 1938 piece, Mars at night, the mythological aspects of his work are foregrounded.
